



Lorena Lepori's figurative oil paintings have a narrative based on the representation of femininity playing with archetypes, stereotypes, cliché and personal memories translated and delivered in a contemporary scene. Her concept is meticulously focused on what defines feminine qualities. Her subjects are mostly placed against an omnipresent black background which creates a dramatic contrast with the pop bright colors of the subjects outfits. She relies on mythical protagonists and memories from her past.

Rachel Pieters is a self-taught artist, and works mainly in oils and graphite and in the Contemporary Realist or Contemporary Figurative styles. Intrigued by ideas of duality, her artwork often explorers performers in a variety of arts, both on stage in all their glory and magnificence, and off-stage in their quiet moments when they are their most intimate selves. Trained as a Graphic Designer, she took up traditional art again in 2018. Her work has been included in several group shows and is held in both local and international collections.






Paulina Aubey's LEGO portraits ingeniously merge popular form with popular content in order to question our relationship to celebrity. Having begun her artistic career working with pastels, Aubey's passion for pop culture inspired her to try her hand with a more popular medium: LEGO bricks. She has elevated this unusual medium to the status of fine art, creating expressive portrayals of contemporary icons and the idols of her 1980s childhood. Her portraits of religious figures, movie characters, and pop stars—including David Bowie and Marilyn Monroe—blur the distinction between figurative and abstract art. They appear highly detailed from a distance and become pixelated upon closer inspection; this viewing experience prompts audiences to reflect on how much we can ever truly understand our idols. In order to create her portraits, Aubey chooses a digital image of her subject and manipulates it to create the desired expression and color scheme before selecting appropriate blocks of LEGO to build the work.

Still making mountains. Still counting my chickens. Still biting off more. Still a square peg.


Still lonely & high-strung—







It takes a longer time to accept that that something is the Great Mystery and the moon.


You can hitch your star to the moon because everyone believes that the moon affects the tides even you.





Athena was not what they expected Tilting into the back story of Greece But if parallels must be drawn then lift her out of sleep


Bring her back in 4-inch heels And purple fingernails Put her in my body I'm not afraid to be forgotten








